So you want to be an executor?

The upcoming "lunch and learn" workshop to be presented by the Algonquin Valley Branch of the National Association of Federal Retirees will cover the responsibilities of an executor of an estate in Ontario.

The workshop, as part of an estate planning series, will attempt to provide an understanding of the duties of an executor tasked with winding down an estate; lead you through the key responsibilities; and, assist you with helping to make your executor's tasks easier to accomplish.

The presentation, to be given by Leo Buckley, a mem-

ber of the Algonquin Valley Branch executive, will address in detail the five general steps that an executor may be required to complete.

These general steps include: making preliminary arrangements; securing assets; valuing the estate; paying debts and filing tax returns; and making final distribution of the estate.

The workshop, open to Federal Retiree members and their guests, will start at the Deep River Royal Canadian Legion on May 12 at 11:30 am with a meet and greet of the participants, lunch at noon, followed at 12:30 pm with the workshop that will last approximately one hour.

Come and enjoy the gathering and discussion.

If you cannot make this date, there will be presentations made at the Royal Canadian Legions in Pembroke on June 7 and in Petawawa on September 22.

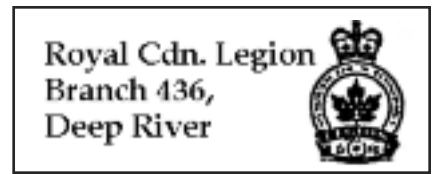
